Intermediate Apprenticeship in Horse Care

On this apprenticeship you will learn how to maintain the health and welfare of horses, prepare horses and customers for rides and carry out other general horse care duties.

Many Equine businesses are small employers, therefore, each person has an important role to play within the organisation. On the apprenticeship, in addition to the horse care skills you will learn skills such as customer relations, communication and planning and organising. HTP offers the Horse Care apprenticeship pathway and within this pathway there are two qualifications available – Horse Care or Horse Care and Riding.

Who is this apprenticeship for?

The Level 2 Apprenticeship in Equine provides an entry route into the sector and is suitable for those people who have a keen interest and are looking for a career working with horses.

How could I progress?

Following successful completion there are many opportunities available which could include progressing on to the Advanced Apprenticeship and specialising within the profession or progressing into other Further and/or Higher Education.

Training Methods

The programme is predominantly work-based, with the required 20% 'Off-the-Job Training' being delivered at one of our campuses or in the workplace. Additional knowledge sessions, including regular reviews containing activity planning and target setting by a visiting training consultant.

Assessment Method

To achieve this Apprenticeship, candidates must demonstrate they meet the stated outcomes and have acquired the required knowledge, skills and behaviours. This is achieved through successfully completing a portfolio and work-based practical assessments.

Intermediate Apprenticeship in Horse Care

Competence Qualification - Level 2 Diploma in Work-based Horse Care (Horse Care or Horse Care and Riding)

Level 2 Diploma in Work-based Horse Care (Horse Care) – To achieve this qualification the learner must gain a minimum of 41 credits. 18 credits from Group A and 23 credits from Group B.

Level 2 Diploma in Work-based Horse Care (Horse Care and Riding) - To achieve the qualification learners must gain a minimum of 50 credits. 18 credits from Group A, 3 out of 6 units Group B and 5 units from Group C.
